#### What's a TCTAC?

A TCTAC is a technical assistance center guiding local governments, community-based organizations, higher education institutions, schools, and federally recognized tribal nations through the federal grants process.

There are 3 national and 15 regional TCTACs located across the country.

In Region 4, our TCTAC is based at the Research Triangle Institute, providing a network of policy and researchers experts with regional knowledge.

### What's the South Carolina Hub?

The South Carolina Hub delivers technical assistance to navigate federal grants within the state of South Carolina.

We are based at the University of South Carolina, which offers a dedicated line to research faculty, students, and campus resources helpful in applying for federal grants.

Our core functions are to assist you in applying for federal grants, connect you with helpful campus resources, and build networks across the state.

## Where is this money coming from?


The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and Inflation Reduction Act provide the largest financial investments in infrastructure, clean energy and climate action in United States history, much of which has been matched by private investments.

This money is available in the form of grants, cooperative agreements, loans, rebates, and direct spending.

#### What grants are available now?

Currently, there are over 20 grants available to fund resilient buildings, clean ports programs, electric bus systems, grid innovation and resilience, indoor air pollution in schools, energy auditor training programs, electric battery recycling programs, and climate pollution reduction programs.
